UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Adoption of the On-lot Sewage Management Program Ordinance has been postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic-Nancy emailed Tim Wagner the Board's decision to postpone adoption. There has been no response from him.

NEW BUSINESS

A dispute regarding who owns the upper portion of the dead end on Knuth Rd has come up. A written complaint was submitted to the township and read by Supervisor Miller, from Eddie Gault and Susan Fulmer, who are building a new home there regarding Jeanette Shelton parking on the roadway blocking access to their property. A motion was made to authorize Engineer Jerry Spease to conduct an engineering study on Knuth Road to determine the ownership of the road; Miller/Raudensky. Angela Ehrhardt, who owns the home at the dead end and is the owner of the property where her daughter Jeanette Shelton is living, commented that not all of Knuth Rd is a township road and relayed the past history as she understands it. She has several questions that need to be investigated for answers. Motion carried.
